## What is Plasma Pen?

Plasma Pen, sometimes called Fibroblast, is an advanced, non surgical skin tightening and skin rejuvenation service that is particular suited to tightening skin above and below the eyes, around the mouth, on the forehead, the neck, the décolletage, the abdomen – in fact, anywhere there is loose skin or wrinkle formation.

Following the numbing of the skin using a lidocaine based topical anaesthetic, I place a matrix of tiny burns in the target area and. As the skin heals, it covers the little wounds which produces a tightening effect. Also, over the following 4-8 weeks as part of the wound healing process, the body sends fibroblast cells (skin cells) to heal the wounds. Fibroblasts create collagen, which gives the skin its strength and elastin, which gives the skin its elasticity and the skin is effectively rejuvenated. The results are long lasting, the skin just starts to age again after the healing process has completed. Often one treatment is enough, but sometimes in cases where there is a lot of loose skin, further treatments (spaced 6-8 weeks apart or when the skin has fully healed) may be required. Further treatments to the same area are offered at a discount.

Multiple areas can be treated at one time. However, when the eye is treated, there is normally swelling which peaks on days 2-3. For this reason, I do not treat the upper lids and the lower lids together as the eyes could swell too much.

## What does it look like afterwards?

After treatment, scabs develop on the area. They start to fall off at around day 5. It is best not to wear makeup before day 5 as the scabs should be left intact as long as possible to protect the underlying healing skin.

The skin maybe pinkish when the scabs fall off. This is normal and will return to normal colour over the followings days / weeks. It is important that the skin be protected from the sun for at least 3 months after treatment.

## Side Effects

Scabbing of the skin (this always occurs and is part of the treatment process)

Redness

Bruising

Swelling

Pin prick bleeding

Hyperpigmentation (could occur in darker skins, or skins that are not protected from the sun for 3 months after treatment or skins that have a tendency to hyperpigment). A patch test can be performed prior to treatment in “at risk” skins.

Infection (rare, could occur if the aftercare advice is not adhered to or in diabetic clients. Clients with severe diabetes cannot be treated)
